### FROM AROUND THE SCHOOL

#### **CLASS 1K**

In 1K this week we have been reading **Woolly** by Sam Childs. The story links to our History topic Dinosaurs

and Cave Men. Within the sequence, the children were able to explore and empathise with the character's feelings.



For Mental Health Awareness Week we

have been looking at how anxiety can affect us in our daily activities. We talked about worries and discussed what we can do to help our mental wellbeings.

In Science we have been learning about seasonal changes. We went to the playground to conduct a simple wind test. We scored the speed the wind was travelling

and how difficult it was to run on that day.

#### **CLASS 5E**

In 5E this week we have been writing our own sci-fi narratives, based on Robot Girl by

Malorie Blackman. We have now finished our stories and have started editing them to have them ready for publishing.



This week is mental health week, so we are thinking about ways to make sure that our mental health is good.



In 5E we take regular brain breaks, especially after morning play and lunchtime. This helps us to become calm by deep breathing and listening to the chime.

#### **ART**

In our Art lessons, Year 1 have been drawing images of Dinosaurs and used plasticine to make models. They will also be using air drying clay and paint to make fossils. Year 2 are learning about the artist Andre Derain and Paul Klee and they have been using Oil pastels, Chalk Pastels in the process of



making Cityscapes collages. Year 3 children are currently learning about volcanoes so they have made 3D models made paper mache. Year 4 are learning about the Rainforests and they have produced some amazing drawings using different media. Year 5 have been using chalk pastels to illustrate space and the different planets using some techniques they learnt in previous lessons such as blending, thatching and tippling. Year 6 used chalk pastels to draw the illustrations by Catherine Hyde from the book 'The Firebird'.
