

CLASS REC 2



This term we have been learning about our family and friends.

In Understanding the World we have enjoyed sharing photos of ourselves and our families with our friends. We have been looking at how we have changed and all the different things we do with our families.

In Art we have been creating our own selfportraits. First we sketched our portraits on our whiteboards, next we sketched our portraits on paper and now we are





painting our portraits which has been very enjoyable.





In maths, we have been exploring **number** bonds within 10.

During our RE lesson we had the opportunity to go to church, attend mass and learn

about all the different things in church that are of significance. We even enjoyed constructing our own churches in the outside area.

ing our bodies healthy by eating a **balanced diet.** In RE, we have been reading **bible stories about Jesus** helping the apostles through the power of the Holy

Spirit. In geography, we have been discussing what life is like down at the seaside and what you can do during a seaside holiday. In PSHE, we have been discussing being safe when



taking medicines. We also talked about safe and unsafe substances around the house. We have also been working extra hard this week to prepare for our **class assembly**, which took place this morning! Thank you

CLASS 3C

We have been working very hard in year 3 this half term.

In English, we have reading the book **Escape From Pompeii** by Christina Balit. Everyone worked hard to write a letter of advice to the main characters in the story and this week we have been writing our own **newspaper reports** about the disaster.

In Geography, we have also been doing work about volcanoes. We learnt about the structure of **volcanoes** and made comparisons between Mount Vesuvius in Italy and Mount Cameroon in Cameroon. We also considered why people might want to live near an active volcano.

In Computing, we have been learning how to use **PowerPoint**. We found out how to add news slides and type information. In addition, we learnt how to find an image on the internet and paste it into our PowerPoint presentation. We are looking forward about learning how to animate images and altering the transitions between slides.



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
