FROM AROUND THE SCHOOL

CLASS 6T

In writing, Year 6 is using the text 'The Arrival' by Shaun Tan. The book is about a man's journey to find a better life for him and family. For one lesson, we have imagined we were on a boat and wrote a character description explaining about our-



selves and why we were travelling. We are thinking about why people need to travel, how they might feel and what they want to achieve.

In humanities, our history topic is 'The Victorians' as part of our time travellers unit. This week we looked at schools and compared education to modern times. We investigated the school day, subjects that were taught and punishments the children got for not making the right choices. For many of the children it was a shock to see the sizes of the classes in those times.



Every week, we are very lucky to have singing with one of the choir masters from St George's Cathedral. Thank you to Charlie who really does make sure the children hit all the right notes!

CLASS 4J



In Science, we have been learning about electricity. The children made predictions about whether or not they think the pictures of some circuits were com-

plete or incomplete. After that, they carried out tests to see if their predictions were correct or incorrect.

The children have been enjoying a wide variety of activities in PE. They also develop transferable skills such listening well and team work skills that they can apply to other curriculum areas.



NURSERY

This term our theme is All Creatures Great and Small and we will be looking at some amazing fiction and non-fiction books including The Snail and the Whale, What the Ladybird Heard, The Fly and Tadpole's Promise. We will be using lots of mark making and drama to share our ideas and likes about these

books. We will continue to follow Ruth Miskins's Read, Write, Inc phonics. In Maths we will be counting objects, reciting numbers to 5 and beyond, sorting different objects into groups, begin to learn that numbers are made up of smaller numbers, talk about and identify patterns around us and create our own patterns, show an awareness of shape similarities and differences between objects and explore full and empty The children will continue to gain in confidence and sing some of their favourite nursery rhymes and

songs and participate in lots of messy Arts and Crafts. In RE we will be looking at stories about animals from the Bible.

Please remember that Nursery children need to come in wearing the correct PE kit on Wednesdays.

I look forward for your continued support throughout this term.
