
Dear parents and carers

FROM AROUND THE SCHOOL

CLASS 2J



In 2J this week we have been looking at 'The Journey Home' by Frann Preston Gannon. Our topic this term is 'Going green' — we have been reading about how we can save the planet and we have been using atlases to identify the conti-

nents and the oceans of the world. Our RE topic is 'The Good News' – we have read the story of how Jesus helped Simon Peter and Andrew and we have read the story of Jesus visiting the temple with Mary and Joseph. In science, we have been learning about plants and identifying different seeds. In maths, we are learning to subtract a two-digit number from a two-digit number, using partitioning and empty number lines. In PSHE, we have discussed safe and unsafe situations and strangers. For our Lifesavers focus, we have

been discussing where we get our money from. We have also considered how we can get money and how we can volunteer without needing to be paid.



CLASS 1L

In 1L this week, we have been reading a book called 'Tadpole's Promise' by Jeanne Willis. From the book, we have been learning

In maths, we have been **solving addition word prob-lems** using number lines.

In science, we have been learning about **animals including humans.** We sorted animals into the groups they belong to and spoke about their diets. We had Trotter, the rabbit visit us. We spoke about the group




Trotter belongs to and the type of food he eats.




Class 3C
