### FROM AROUND THE SCHOOL

#### **CLASS 1L**

In 1L this week, we have been working hard to complete our spring term assessments for reading and maths.



In DT, we have been making finger puppets and pop-out cards.



In maths, we have been learning about **money** and identify which coins to use to purchase an item from the shop.

We have also been continuing with our science topic which is 'Plants'.



We have been learning about

different types of garden and wild plants. Using what we've learnt, we were able to identify if our class plant is a garden plant or a wild plant.

This week we have been celebrating **book week** with many fun reading activities. On Monday, we had a special visit from an **author** who told us stories through song, dance and acting. On Thursday, was **world book day** and we dressed up as our favourite book characters!

#### CLASS 3C

This week we celebrated **World Book Day.** On Monday, we had a fantastic story telling session from the **author Sally Pomme Clayton** also known as 'Pomme.' Everyone in 3C had a wonderful time listening to the stories she performed. On Thursday, we all came dressed as our favourite book characters. It was lovely to see everyone in their **costumes** celebrating the joys of reading.

In our Writing lessons, we have been enjoying doing work inspired by the story **Black Dog** by Levi Penfold. In class we learnt how to use **speech punctuation** and also had fun creating **expanded noun phrases** to describe the black dog in the story.

Finally last week, we had an exciting trip to **Kew Gardens** where we visited the **palm house** and had two engaging workshops where our activities included studying **plants** through microscopes and learning all about **seed dispersal**. We were even lucky enough to see the **world's largest seed – the coco-de-mer.** 



#### **CLASS 2J**



In 2J this week, we have been working hard to complete our spring term assessments for reading and maths. We are also continuing to work on our topic 'Going green', with a focus of looking at maps and drawing our own maps of the school. In PSHE we have been discussing ways that we can keep our bodies and minds healthy. In maths, we have been learning

about fractions of amounts and practising

how to find a half or a quarter of a given number. We have also been continuing with our science topic which is 'Plants'. We are experimenting what happens to seeds when they are placed in different conditions, e.g., what happens to a seed if it has no light or heat? In art, we have been practising how to make **coil pots** using Plasticine.

How has a certain technology changed over time?


How has time telling technology advanced over time?

We are thrilled to announce our Spring 2 Term Science Poster Project, which will

also be coinciding with British Science Week. This is an engaging and educational opportunity for your family and is part of our ongoing commitment to fostering a love for science and learning at English Martyrs' Primary School.

This term's, topic is centred around the theme of "TIME". The aim is to encourage your child's curiosity and creativity of the world around them in exploring scientific questions related to this topic. Children and families can research any one idea or question around the theme of 'time'. Some ideas to help you could be:

- 1. How has technology changed over time?
- 2. How has time telling technology changed over time?
- 3. How might the world look in future years to come, or what was life like in the past and how has it changed?
- 4. Nature is full of timely topics too lifecycles, lifespans, seasons, evolution, and gestation.
- 5. How has electricity changed over time?
- 6. How about researching space and all the different discoveries and changes in technology?
- 7. Or how about researching a scientist who has made an impact in any of these fields?

We invite your child to research and express their understanding in any way they wish through an A4 page wall displayable poster. This could take the form of an art piece, poster, drawing, collage, creative written piece (eg. written science experiment, influential letter, diary entry), photos of a model they have created, or any other creative means they feel inspired to undertake.

Please ensure that the completed projects are submitted to the front office throughout the term. We would love to receive posters as soon as possible, as we would like to display these during British Science Week, which we will be celebrating during the week of 18th March 2024. Don't forget to make sure to include an explanation of your work, your name and classroom. We will be giving out certificates and lots of wonderful prizes for our winning posters at the end of this term too. We will also be submitting some of our favourites in a further competition being run by the British Science Association.

This is an excellent opportunity for your child and family to not only investigate science around them, show-case their scientific knowledge but also to be acknowledged for their hard work and creativity. We encourage you to support your child in this exciting endeavour, providing them with the resources and encouragement they may need.
