FROM AROUND THE SCHOOL

CLASS 6T



6T and 6M – have been working with the Southwark Parks sharing ideas on what they think will benefit the whole community for the **Nursery Row Park.** They have looked at plans and architecture drawings and discussed the proposed changes to the area. They have enjoyed working with a designer and having their ideas heard.

In RE we are we have started looking at **Holy Week.**We reflected on the thoughts and feeling of Jesus on
Palm Sunday and what the people would have seen
and heard. We have also been asking **'What if?'** questions to develop our understanding of our faith.

CLASS 4J

In **Science**, we have been learning about **States of Matter**.

The children made predictions about whether or not gas has weight. After



that, they carried out an investigation using balloons to find out if their predictions were correct.

We have been studying the poem Jabberwocky by Lewis Carroll. In this poem, there is one poetic convention that Carroll has used a lot. It is portmanteau in which he has joined together two words in order to



create an entirely new word. The
children have
been enjoying

what the poem
means.

NURSERY

This term our theme is '**Growing'** and we will be doing lots of planting of flowers, fruit and vegetables and looking at how we grow ourselves! We will be reading high quality texts around this which

include; The Tiny Seed, Titch, I will Never Eat a Tomato, Baby Brains and a Tadpole's Promise. We will be using lots of mark making and drama to share our ideas and likes/dislikes about these books. We will continue to follow Ruth Miskins's Read, Write, Inc phonics. In Maths we will be looking at **Comparisons** which include; sorting different ob-

jects into groups, Composition, Patterns and Space, Shape and Measures. The children will continue to gain more confidence and sing some of their favourite nursery rhymes and songs and participate in lots of messy Arts and Crafts including collage, paper making, Easter bonnets and baskets. In RE we will be focussing on **Lent** and the build up to Easter learning about stories from the Bible and songs about Jesus. In PE we will continue to find out

about the importance of **exercise** and play fun running games about fruit and vegetables.

Please remember that Nursery children need to come in wearing the correct PE kit on Wednesdays.

How has a certain technology changed over time?


How has time telling technology advanced over time?

We are thrilled to announce our Spring 2 Term Science Poster Project, which will

also be coinciding with British Science Week. This is an engaging and educational opportunity for your family and is part of our ongoing commitment to fostering a love for science and learning at English Martyrs' Primary School.

This term's, topic is centred around the theme of "TIME". The aim is to encourage your child's curiosity and creativity of the world around them in exploring scientific questions related to this topic. Children and families can research any one idea or question around the theme of 'time'. Some ideas to help you could be:

- 1. How has technology changed over time?
- 2. How has time telling technology changed over time?
- 3. How might the world look in future years to come, or what was life like in the past and how has it changed?
- 4. Nature is full of timely topics too lifecycles, lifespans, seasons, evolution, and gestation.
- 5. How has electricity changed over time?
- 6. How about researching space and all the different discoveries and changes in technology?
- 7. Or how about researching a scientist who has made an impact in any of these fields?

We invite your child to research and express their understanding in any way they wish through an A4 page wall displayable poster. This could take the form of an art piece, poster, drawing, collage, creative written piece (eg. written science experiment, influential letter, diary entry), photos of a model they have created, or any other creative means they feel inspired to undertake.

Please ensure that the completed projects are submitted to the front office throughout the term. We would love to receive posters as soon as possible, as we would like to display these during British Science Week, which we will be celebrating during the week of 18th March 2024. Don't forget to make sure to include an explanation of your work, your name and classroom. We will be giving out certificates and lots of wonderful prizes for our winning posters at the end of this term too. We will also be submitting some of our favourites in a further competition being run by the British Science Association.

This is an excellent opportunity for your child and family to not only investigate science around them, show-case their scientific knowledge but also to be acknowledged for their hard work and creativity. We encourage you to support your child in this exciting endeavour, providing them with the resources and encouragement they may need.
