FROM AROUND THE SCHOOL THIS WEEK

CLASS 2J

In 2J this week we have been **writing questions** to find out about a mysterious abandoned house held up by trees. In maths we have been **partitioning numbers into tens and ones**.

We have had a lot of fun learning

about the **continents and oceans** of the world in Geography as well as locating the **North and South Pole**.



We talked about some of **Jesus' miracles** and what they teach us about Jesus. Our new topic in science is

'Plants' and we have recorded the

lifecycle of a sun-flower. In Art we have been learning about the artist **Georgia O'Keeffe** and have tried to use different tones to colour




flowers.



CLASS 3C

In 3C we have started reading **Michael Morpurgo's** version of the **Pied Piper of Hamelin** during our English lessons. In class, we have **written in role** as people in the town including a **letter to the Mayor of Hamelin** advising him whether or not to pay the piper for his work.



In our History lessons we have started learning about the **Stone Age**. In our lessons we have looked at the different types of **dwelling** from the period and considered their individual advantages and disadvantages. We also made comparisons between our **diet** and the diet which of someone from the Stone Age period.

Our science topic has been **rocks** and in our lessons we devised our own criteria and classified different rock samples. We also investigated the **hardness** of different rocks and what would happen when they came into contact with **vinegar** which we learnt is an **acid**.

In Religious Education, we have been learning about the **sacrament of Reconciliation** and in class we spent time reading the story of **Zacchaeus**. We reflected on what he might have done differently after meeting **Jesus**.

RE

The whole school have been working hard in Religious Education.

We began the half term by coming together to celebrate the **Feast of The Epiphany**.

In our Early Years classes, the children have been learning more about **Jesus** and how he showed love to children.


In key stage 1, year 1 enjoyed reading and doing work based on the story of the **Presentation in The Temple**. Year 2 have been learning about **John The Baptist and the Baptism of Jesus**.

In key stage 2, year 3 have been learning about the **sacrament of Reconciliation**. As part of this, they have studied the story of **Zacchaeus** the rich tax collector whose life was changed thanks to Jesus. As part of this, they wrote in role as Zacchaeus reflecting on the changes he made to his life. Like Year 1, Year 4 have been busy learning the story of the Presentation in the Temple. In The Church we celebrated this on the **feast of Candlemas** which is this Monday.

Year 5 have been reflecting on the **Beatitudes** and how they can live them out in their life and year 6 have been learning all about the **New Covenant** Jesus made with us. They have also been learning more about the **Mass**.

Finally Saturday is the **feast day of St John Bosco** the saint which 4J are named after.
